Yom Kippur Prayer Guide

“Pray for the peace of Jerusalem; they shall prosper that love thee.”

(Psalm 122:6)

Pray for **Jewish people to come to faith in Messiah Jesus**. Ask God to show them the truth of His Word — that His Son, Yeshua, is the promised Messiah whom many await.

Pray for **Jewish believers to grow strong in their faith** — many face extreme losses when they accept Yeshua as Messiah. Pray for the Church to surround them, disciple, encourage and walk with them.

Pray for **Jewish believers to be strong and bold witnesses** to family and friends who do not yet know Jesus.

Pray for the **families of these believers**, that they will see the light of Messiah in the lives of those who have come to Yeshua.

Pray for believers who are privileged to have Jewish people in their lives, pray for a **strong testimony of faith in Jesus**. And pray for understanding of the Christian community in sharing their faith. We are not looking for people to lose their “Jewishness” in the process, but rather to follow the One who was and is “the King of the Jews.”

Enemies surround Israel. Pray that fear and tension will draw Israelis to repent of sin and seek the One who is the only source of true peace and comfort. Pray that Israel’s enemies will come to know the Prince of Peace, and share His love for His people.

Pray for godly wisdom for **the leaders of Israel**. Pray that **world leaders** will be led of God in their dealings with Israel.

Pray that **believing Jews and Gentiles living in The Land** will be strong testimonies of God’s work in their lives.

Pray for Life in Messiah workers who are serving diligently, sometimes in difficult conditions, to spread the life and love found through a relationship with Messiah Jesus.

Pray for **spiritual protection** as they daily battle the Enemy who would like their message to end.

Pray for their **physical strength** and for provision for every need of **their families**.

Pray for **God-driven ministries around the world that are committed to reaching Jewish people for the Savior**. May God bless each worker, giving them strength, wisdom and joy in their work.

Finally, brethren, pray for us that the word of the Lord will spread rapidly and be glorified, just as it did also with you” (II Thess. 3:1).
